# LEARNING TO NAVIGATE TURBULENT TIMES WITH THE UD PCS POCKETMBA

Empowering innovation through strategic competitive intelligence

Developing a drug that significantly improves patients' lives and meets their medical needs can take 10 to 15 years. In the fiercely competitive and complex process of bringing a new drug to market, Incyte—an innovative global biopharmaceutical company based in Wilmington, Delaware—must proactively prepare for the next wave of innovative treatments.

To tackle this challenge, Tom (Qingjiu) Tao, assistant professor of management at the University of Delaware's Alfred Lerner College of Business and Economics, has designed a customized nine-month scenario planning exercise to empower Incyte teams to navigate the intricate landscape of drug development and launch, all within the framework of UD's Division of Professional and Continuing Studies (UD PCS) and Lerner College program.

Tao, the director of the PocketMBA program, considers the ability to gather, analyze and use information to make strategic business decisions a core capability for any company.

"People participating in our program want to bring good things to this world. To achieve that, a company must be a learning organization," he said. "The individuals who work at Incyte are a diverse group of smart, dedicated people, genuinely interested in addressing unmet medical

needs and making meaningful contributions. Their commitment to continuous learning and growth is part of what drives their success."

To help participants integrate competitive intelligence as an essential business practice and foster a mindset and culture focused on understanding the competitive landscape, forecasting potential futures and generating actionable insights, Tao and Incyte teams identified four plausible future scenarios based on two critical uncertainties in drug development.

In these distinct scenarios, teams of participants were challenged to make strategic, data-driven recommendations in response to various potential Food and Drug Administration (FDA) actions, competitor moves, industry developments and fluctuations in the economy and investment landscape. They had to consider significant factors in each context, including designing and implementing inclusive clinical trials, ensuring treatment safety and affordability, nurturing exceptional talent and adapting to global health trends—all while striving to streamline research and development (R&D) and production timelines to deliver urgently needed precision medicine as swiftly as possible. The teams included more than 50 employees from every aspect of the company's operations across the United States and Canada.

"The strategic planning project pushed us out of our comfort zone, far beyond what a typical case study would," said Pamella Galluzzi de Castro,

senior manager of strategic sourcing, who develops sourcing strategies and maintains supply chains for the company. “We engaged in multiple discussions and considered the many different viewpoints of our colleagues, which was incredibly constructive, and it challenged our assumptions.”

The collaboration with colleagues outside her daily scope proved to be enlightening for Carrie LaGreca, associate director of external manufacturing, as well. She found that the strategic planning project broadened her perspective on overall business operations, helping her understand how different aspects of the company function and why certain decisions are made.

“It was incredibly valuable to gain this broader view beyond my focus on manufacturing,” she said.

Grace Wong, director of medical affairs at Incyte Canada, leads her team in forming scientific and research partnerships to enhance patient care and advance Incyte’s scientific goals.

“The course is incredibly useful because it covers a wide range of topics and includes hands-on strategic exercises,” she said. “The group project challenged us to consider how drug development must adapt to a changing landscape beyond our daily tasks. These insights are highly relevant to our ongoing efforts to create impactful solutions that improve patient outcomes.”

Learning how to lead in a competitive healthcare environment is also a vital component of this PocketMBA program. Instructor Rita Landgraf, professor of practice and distinguished health services administrator at UD, helps participants identify strategies to enhance their leadership capacity.

“The PocketMBA program incorporates evidence-based research, practical strategies and engagement with a diverse group of faculty and professionals,” Landgraf said. “Witnessing the final scenario project presented by individual cross-departmental teams was truly exciting. It was evident that participants not only gained valuable knowledge in leadership and strategic planning but also cultivated strong relationships to advance Incyte’s mission.”

The PocketMBA program embodies UD PCS’ commitment to equipping professionals with the skills necessary to excel in dynamic business environments. By integrating competitive intelligence analytics and fostering essential soft skills, the program prepares participants to navigate and lead in rapidly evolving fields.

“The ability to anticipate and adapt to future challenges is crucial for success,” Tao said. “Our PocketMBA program is designed to instill these capabilities, ensuring that professionals are prepared not only for today’s demands but are also ready to drive innovation and growth in the future.”

# FROM THE CLASSROOM TO THE COURTROOM

UD PCS Paralegal Certificate graduates find careers  
at the Delaware Department of Justice

While their paths to the Delaware Department of Justice (DDOJ) had different beginnings, Cynthia Good and Sepideh Tarighati became legal professionals through the same avenue: the UD PCS Paralegal Certificate program. The yearlong program, which trains adult learners in the delivery of legal services, gave Good, new to law, and Tarighati, a lawyer from Iran, the tools to pursue fulfilling legal careers from very dissimilar starting points.

Before enrolling, Good, a 2024 graduate and current legal administrative specialist for the DDOJ, successfully changed careers once before from education to accounting. After nearly two decades in accounting, she took a hiatus to homeschool her daughter and reentered the workforce seeking a new challenge.

“People had mentioned to me that because of my organizational skills and my attention to detail that I would make a good paralegal,” said Good, who selected UD’s program for its condensed format and cost-efficiency.

With no prior legal experience, Good recalls UD’s program gave her an introduction to the field overall and helped hone the skills she’d need to pursue any legal administrative role. She was particularly inspired by the paralegals and administrative specialists who visited her final module, Criminal Law and

Procedure, taught by William Leonard, deputy attorney general for Delaware.

Initially struggling to find a paralegal position, Good’s connection to the program led her to secure an administrative specialist role in the Criminal Division, Leonard’s department. While she wasn’t selected at first, she was Leonard’s first call when the position reopened.

“I interviewed in the fall, and wasn’t hired until six months later,” joked Good, who became colleagues with a favorite teacher.

Tarighati, a 2020 program graduate and current paralegal for the DDOJ’s Fraud Division, overcame many personal and professional obstacles to return to her legal career. After earning her master’s in law, Tarighati practiced in Tehran for a few years before emigrating to the U.S. in 2014.

“I wanted to start again—to go to law school—but I realized that would be a long shot for me,” said Tarighati, uncertain about the academic commitment whilst learning a second language.

After attending UD’s English Language Institute (ELI), Tarighati decided PCS’ Paralegal Certificate was a more realistic way to reenter her profession. Although she planned to enroll a year prior, Tarighati delayed after she became pregnant with her daughter, and didn’t start classes until

mid-2019. About halfway through the program, another unforeseeable impediment arose: the COVID-19 pandemic.

Balancing online learning, a newborn and her coursework, Tarighati admits she considered dropping out if it weren’t for the guidance of Monica Horton. A judge in the Delaware Court of Common Pleas and former UD instructor, Horton taught her first module, Introduction to Law for Paralegals. Struggling with the language barrier, Tarighati was encouraged by Horton to continue, giving her pep talks at the end of each class.

Since graduating from the program, both alumnae have found fulfillment at the DDOJ in careers that continue to grow.

“While I’m happy in my current role ... I would like to move into a paralegal position at some point,” said Good. In the meantime, she views her contributions as a small, but integral part of the justice system.

Tarighati is happiest when she’s connecting with the plaintiffs, recalling a time when she helped victims of board prosecutions and, more recently, those affected by criminal fraud cases.

“I know they’re struggling and in really bad situations,” said Tarighati, who found her purpose supporting clients through difficult times.

## EXPLORING FUTURES

UD PCS' pre-college programs spark passion and possibility

Last summer, high school students from across the country gathered at the University of Delaware's Newark campus for one-week immersive programs in Forensic Science or Autonomous Driving through the Division of Professional and Continuing Studies (UD PCS). These pre-college summer programs offer students a glimpse into real-world STEM careers—and a head start on their college journey—guided by researchers at the forefront of innovation through engaging, hands-on experiences.

For Olivia Stany, a junior from Tennessee, the summer experience was a turning point. “UD’s program stood out because it explored every aspect of forensic science in depth. Hands-on experiences like DNA fingerprinting and electrophoresis, combined with insights from professionals in the field, helped me discover what I’m truly passionate about and gave me a clearer vision for college and beyond,” she said.

The Forensic Science program immerses students in the full spectrum of investigative science—from crime scene analysis and lab techniques to courtroom procedures. Led by UD faculty in the Department of Medical and Molecular Sciences and real-world forensic experts from the Delaware State Police and Division of Forensic Science,

students work in state-of-the-art labs and visit active crime labs and police units.

“Hearing the stories from professionals like Anthony DiNardo [Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) section administrator for the Delaware State Police, State Bureau of Identification] made me want to pursue forensic science even more,” Stany said. “One case he shared—involving fingerprinting in a homicide investigation—was both horrifying and fascinating. It showed me how impactful and complex this work really is.”

Delaware senior C.J. Schaffer, like Stany, discovered just how impactful hands-on learning can be when forensic science is brought to life through real-world experiences.

“I thought it would be mostly lectures, but from the very first day we were in the lab, using the same equipment college students use,” Schaffer said. “Touring the State Forensic Department was eye-opening—we saw the labs, the freezer rooms, and even spoke with the head of the morgue while he was in full scrubs, actively working. It felt surreal. Being on UD’s campus and working in real college facilities made everything feel tangible. I could actually see myself here, studying this field. That realization was one of the most valuable parts of the experience.”

The Autonomous Driving Academy offers a deep dive into robotics, programming and

artificial intelligence. Students collaborate in teams to build sensor-packed car models and program them to navigate obstacle courses—all under the guidance of researchers from UD’s Connected and Autonomous Research Laboratory (CAR Lab).

“I’ve been coding since I was 6, and I wanted to go beyond the limits of what I could do in robotics competitions,” said Hanyu Zhang, a ninth grader from Washington state. “The autonomous driving program was great because we got to work with advanced sensors like 360-degree LiDAR and AI models that helped our robots detect obstacles like stop signs and construction cones. That really excited me—it was exactly what I was looking for.”

Beyond technical skills, both programs emphasize college readiness and personal growth. Students earn a digital badge and personalized reference letter for college applications, while also building essential soft skills like teamwork, communication and critical thinking.

“What surprised me most was how much creativity goes into research,” said Haramrit Bal, a junior from California. “I used to think experiments were just about following a set of steps, but designing a good one takes trial and error—and a lot of innovation. You have to approach problems from new angles to discover solutions you hadn’t considered before. The hands-on work was not only fun but incredibly satisfying when everything came together.”

Beyond lab work, students also form lasting friendships and connections.

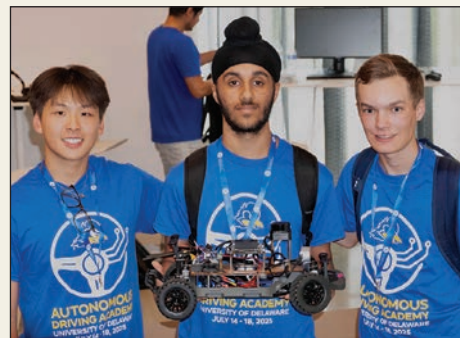
“Having an open mind really helped me during the program. Working in teams and hearing different perspectives—especially from students from other states—was eye-opening,” Stany said. “We even started a group chat to share ideas and plan our projects. That experience definitely improved my teamwork and communication skills, and the support from faculty boosted my confidence. I felt safe and encouraged every step of the way.”

For Bal too, the teamwork involved was especially valuable. “I got to hear different perspectives from people with diverse backgrounds. It also helped me become more confident speaking in group settings and presenting my findings. Collaborating with experienced peers helped me grow, and I’ve carried that experience over to my own robotics team.”

For many students, seeing cutting-edge research firsthand was a pivotal moment in their perspective on STEM careers.

“We got to see what each professor was working on, which was amazing,” Zhang said. “One was developing a voice-controlled wheelchair to help move patients, and another was building a simulation environment for testing self-driving cars. It was inspiring to see how their research connects to real-world problems.”

As the demand for skilled professionals in STEM fields continues to grow, programs like these help students envision their future—and take the first steps toward it.

“The program gave me a real sense of what engineering is like, not just being told what to do but solving problems and creating solutions. It strengthened my passion for engineering,” Zhang said. “With AI and robotics advancing so quickly, I realized I can’t ever get complacent. I always have to keep learning and improving. This program helped prepare me for that mindset.”

While Zhang found inspiration in the evolution of engineering and technology, Schaffer’s experience prompted deeper self-reflection about the realities of working in forensic science.

“Something I learned in the program that I didn’t know previously was that working in the field of forensics means you have to be able to testify in court, which is really high pressure,” Schaffer said. “So, reflecting on my strengths and challenges, I’ll have to learn how to push through that; that’s going to be something that I have to work through.”

For students eager to explore careers in biomedical science, criminal justice, robotics or AI, UD PCS pre-college programs offer more than just summer learning—they offer inspiration, direction and a glimpse into what’s possible. At UD, summer isn’t just a season—it’s a launchpad.

Both programs are held on the University of Delaware’s Newark campus and are open to high school students nationwide.
